Professor Lee Sing Kong is a horticulturist by training and a Professor of Biological Sciences at the Nanyang Technological University. After an illustrious career in the civil service, Prof Lee joined NIE in 1991 and was in various positions of leadership. He spearheaded several initiatives, most notably, the redesigning of NIE's organisational structure based on the matrix model. In 2000, as Dean of the Graduate Programmes and Research Office, he implemented a wide range of professional development initiatives for teachers.

Dr Melissa Fullwood is a Principal Investigator at the Cancer Science Institute, a joint Principal Investigator at the Institute for Molecular and Cell Biology (IMCB) and a Nanyang Assistant Professor at the School of Biological Sciences in NTU. Her current research is on 3-dimensional genome organization and transcription in cancer. She is an NRF Fellow and won the Singapore Young Scientist Award in 2014. She is the President of SIBiol.
